## 

Lutherans have been making quilts for Lutheran World Relief since 1945. I have been told that Alma Swartos brought quilting to Christ the King when she moved here from South Dakota - bringing the practice from her home congregation. A congregation is itself much like a quilt. The congregation brings together the fabrics of people's lives; it gathers together the pieces that eventually make a whole. A quilt's pieces come from old clothing: from remnants or bolts of fabric that have not yet taken form. And the Scriptures say we are a "remnant" people.

And not only is a congregation like a quilt; its life together - its mission - is also like the act of quilting. People who are involved in mission stitch together the pieces gathered. We look for ways to make sense of things that, in themselves, don't always make sense. We gather together the pieces of a history and tradition that can be said to have endured the breaking of many "threads." We use the names of those who have gone before us, remembering them as the thread that weaves the pieces together. We proudly tell the stories of the saints of our congregation, the living and the dead. We know that if we are willing to stick with it long enough-if we are willing to see the whole emerging from the separate pieces of "fabric"-the pieces will begin to form a pattern: a pattern for our lives.

The quilt that is life together as a congregation starts with a story about where and how the congregation began. The story describes the sorrows and joys of a group of consecrated people who knew what they had to do to make their God known. It is in the telling of their stories, added to our own, that the whole story is told. Mission helps us recognize that together our stories are the Gospel made relevant. The quilt that is life together as a congregation is made whole in the events we attend, the compassion offered, the respect shown, the relationships formed, the way resources are stewarded and care is given to those in need. It is the whole quilt: It is the place where we put together the pieces of our dreams.

Like a quilter, we find remnants in all sorts of unlikely places; and we pray for openness.
Like a quilter, we gather the pieces that some would say don't belong together and we pray for the gift of hospitality.
Like the quilter, we recognize that we can sew only one stitch at a time and we pray for patience.
Like the quilter, we are amazed as each piece is sewn together and becomes a whole, and we pray for humility.
Like the quilter, we see how the fabric's colors give depth, a new dimension, and we pray for the ability to accept everyone as our sisters and brothers.
Like the quilter, we see the finished product and we pray with gratitude.
Life together as a congregation is pure gift-the legacy passed on to us by those saints upon whose shoulders we stand lived (and continue to live) their lives being God's healing presence to others. Someday, it will be our turn to pass along the legacy of being God's presence to one another. Then we too will have our own little square of fabric, which-when sewn together with the rest-will make a beautiful warm quilt to be handed down to the next generation.

## Congregational Quilt Project

Each person is invited to decorate a 6 " by 6 " quilt square available at the back of the sanctuary throughout Labor Day weekend. We are envisioning one large quilt made from the squares decorated by anyone who calls Christ the King their spiritual home. The inspiration for this quilt is God's Word. So think about your favorite Bible verse - what images come to mind. Maybe there are a few key words that pop out for you and would fit on the square. Be sure to include at least your first name (or family name if doing it collectively) somewhere on the square.

## What can we do with this quilt square?

You may use any suitable means of decoration- from a traditional quilting pattern (many ideas can be found online) to using fabric paint or markers, embroidery, appliques or another creative choice. Please DO NOT WASH THIS QUILT SQUARE. Please decorate this square, leaving a 1 inch margin on all four sides. We need this space to sew them all together. Here are a few examples. The lower left is a good example of where a mom helped a couple kids do one. We do want a bible citation and a name. So, the lower right could have "Psalm 25:6" and a person's name and it would be what we are looking for.

There are all sorts of possibilities. We intend to hang this in the sanctuary and, like our wall of crosses downstairs, have it become something to look at and talk about.

Let your creativity flow and I am sure that this will not only be a beautiful addition to our sanctuary, but a way for us to thank and praise God for stitching us together as a congregation.
