Grace and Peace A message from Pastor Bryan

Now the birth of Jesus the Messiah took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been engaged to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found to be pregnant from the Holy Spirit. Her husband Joseph, being a righteous man and unwilling to expose her to public disgrace, planned to divorce her quietly. But just when he had resolved to do this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins."



All this took place to fulfill what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet: "Look, the virgin shall become pregnant and give birth to a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel," which means, "God is with us." Matthew 1:18-23

God? With us?

I know that I'm not worthy. Inadequate? Yes. Undeserving? Absolutely. And, yet, there God is, made flesh, wrapped in swaddling cloths, laid in a manger... for me, for you.

Jesus was born amid upheaval and historical change and among people who seemed powerless and hopeless. Today, as Ukraine beats back Russia, as Hamas and Israel seek to erase one another, as hearts are broken and communities ravaged, as inflation squeezes families, and as we are torn apart by politics and derision, Christ's promise comes to us again. When the world feels hopeless, Advent reminds us God is with us.

In chaos, God is with us.

In suffering, God is with us.

In uncertainty, God is with us.

In whatever our family and our community endures, God is always with us.

That God is always with us not only gives us the courage to take stock of the world, but to navigate it in the way that Jesus calls us. That is, to go boldly through this world loving others, stewarding creation, and trying to make the world a better place because we know God is with us and God is our power.

I invite you this Advent to take some intentional time and reflect on the world around you, take stock of the world Christ comes into and notice the areas in which you need God most. What in your world needs more love, more compassion, more reminders that God is with you? How might Christ be coming into this world through you? How might God be using you to make this world a more loving and compassionate place? Advent is a process, not an instant realization. I pray that this process can be full of love and God's presence—a reminder that you are not alone and that God is pointing us to a more loving and peaceful world.


December 31, 2023 Following worship

Electronic Giving

Open your heart without opening your checkbook

Electronic Giving (Direct Debit) is the term used to describe automatic methods for making contributions on a regular basis without the need to write checks, carry cash or prepare envelopes.

Christ the King offers the ability to give electronically. You can choose to give weekly, bi-monthly, monthly or in any way the Lord leads you. Many of our members enjoy the convenience of making utility or other payments electronically; why not give to the Church electronically?

If you have a bill paying feature on your checking account at your bank you can ask your bank to send your contribution in the same way they pay your bills. Or, if you don't, the church has a service that is simple, secure, and easy to set up.

This will help us in our giving when we miss a Sunday and help us to prioritize the Church in our finances and be good stewards of what God has entrusted us. It will also help us in being consistent and obedient in keeping with our commitments that we have made to the Lord.

Three benefits to *Electronic Giving*:

- 1) You are taking a step of faith When you sign up to give electronically, you are deciding in advance to faithfully give.
- 2) You will simplify your life You won't have to remember whether you gave this month or need to send in an offering by mail when you are on a trip.
- 3) You will be helping the church Every person who gives through electronic giving makes our record keeping much easier and saves us from paying check deposit fees and it evens out cash flow.

The Echo Prayer Manager is an app available for both Android and iPhone users. It is both cost and ad free. A simple explanation is that it is a closed group social media app. You are only connected to people in a group you are asked to join... not to the world. Christ the King has a "feed" that once you join you will have all of the up to date prayers of the congregation and you will be able to reach out to those requesting prayer through the comment option.



We are aware that not everyone has a smart phone and that not everyone who does will want to use this app. We will be sending out a weekly email to those who have asked to be on the "prayerchain" email list. If you would like more information on either the app or getting on the email list please contact Taylor in the office.
