Grace and Peace A message from Pastor Bryan

It was during my time as a Vicar at Trinity Lutheran Church in Omaha that I learned about Lutheran World Relief quilting. In the basement on Wednesdays the "Willing Workers" gathered and quilted. I had not ever been a part of a congregation which had such a group and it wasn't something that happened at seminary. I was excited to hear about the impact these quilts made as they traveled the globe; finding their way to refugee camps and disaster relief efforts.

When I worked with the Sudanese refugees who came to Omaha they saw these quilts and had stories of their own about the impact receiving these



quilts had on their lives. They were tents, and walls and ways to wrap up ones belongings. The refugees we resettled here a few years back recognized these quilts as well. I saw them given away to expectant mothers who walked miles to deliver their children at Machame Lutheran Hospital in Tanzania – a "modern" hospital, outfitted with 30 year old technology.



When I came to Christ the King I heard how Alma Swartos brought the ministry from her home congregation in South Dakota. Since then for more than twenty years, a small group of faithful hands have gathered in our congregation's fellowship hall, threading needles and stitching fabric with a purpose far greater than creating beautiful quilts. They were weaving warmth, comfort, and God's love into every square. What began as a humble ministry soon became a beacon of service, wrapping those in need—newborns, the sick, the grieving, and those facing hardship—in tangible reminders of Christ's care.

For more than two decades, this quilting ministry has been a labor of love, uniting members in fellowship and service. Every knot tied was a prayer, every quilt given a blessing. The ministry's reach extended beyond our congregation, touching lives in hospitals, shelters, and mission projects near and far. Each quilt carried a message: "You are loved. You are not alone."

But as seasons change, so too do the rhythms of ministry. This ministry, which when I came, had two tables working on quilts, then one, has grown smaller. Though the passion for service remains, the reality is that we no longer have the numbers to sustain the quilting ministry in its current form.

This is not really a sudden transition. We have attempted to have our young people in Sunday School, Confirmation, and weekend events participate in tying quilts. Phyllis Carlson led a service project activity at a Scout event. We have invited people to stay after worship and tie quilts. None of these events have really yielded the results that suggested this was the form which would keep this ministry sustainable.

As we give thanks for these 20+ years of love sewn into fabric, we also trust that the impact of this ministry will continue. The quilts already made will go on to bless others. The lessons learned—the power of community, the joy of serving, the love in each stitch—will remain woven into the fabric of our congregation.

So now we are at a tipping point. Those remaining would love to see this ministry continue. Currently they gather the first and third Tuesdays at 9am. Invitations to come and participate have been long standing. If this ministry is to continue at Christ the King it will likely need to take a different form shaped by those who would love to be a part of what comes next.

So if you have an interest and an idea to transition this ministry into something sustainable for the next 20 years, please reach out to Phyllis Carlson. To everyone who has participated in, received from, or prayed over this ministry—thank you. You have been part of something beautiful, a ministry that truly embodied Christ's call to love and serve. And though the form may change, the spirit of this work will never unravel.

March 12 – April 9 Table Worship – 6:00pm



The intentionality of Jesus' table ministry and hospitality echoes throughout the gospels as he takes a seat next to the humble and hurting, offering both provision and understanding to their spiritual and physical needs.

This year, instead of going upstairs for worship after soup, we will remain at the table for worship. I'm still working out the details, but it will be a light meal beginning at 6pm. We will transition into a time of worship, listening, and communion.
