What does it really mean to follow Jesus in our everyday lives? While discipleship is a lifelong journey, the church has long recognized **six spiritual practices**—simple, intentional habits—that help us grow deeper in faith and closer to God. This summer, we invite you to explore them in a creative new way through a fun, all-ages challenge called **Disciplopoly**!

Here's a quick look at the Six Marks of Discipleship:

- 1. **Worship** We honor God when we regularly gather to praise, sing, pray, and hear God's Word together. Worship centers our hearts and reminds us who God is.
- 2. **Prayer** Through daily prayer, we build a personal relationship with God—offering our thanks, confessing our struggles, and listening for His voice.
- 3. **Study** Reading Scripture and engaging with Christian teachings helps us understand God's story and our place in it. Faith grows when we ask questions and seek truth.
- 4. **Fellowship** We're not meant to walk this journey alone. Sharing life with others in Christ strengthens and encourages us.
- 5. **Serving** Jesus said he came not to be served but to serve. When we help others, we reflect His love in real, tangible ways.
- 6. **Giving** A generous heart reflects a trust in God's provision. Through financial gifts, time, or talents, we invest in God's kingdom.

# So... what's **DISCIPLOPOLY**

It's a congregational summer challenge designed to help you explore and engage with each of these six areas in fun, meaningful ways. Think of it like a faith-based version of a board game: complete activities in each category, mark your "game board," and see how far you can go by the end of summer!

Whether it's attending a worship service, praying with a friend, studying a Bible passage, bringing a meal to someone, joining a church event, or donating to the food pantry—*it all counts*.

This is not a competition—it's an invitation. An invitation to deepen your faith, discover new rhythms, and experience the joy of following Jesus more intentionally.



# **School Kits for Lutheran World Relief**

Again this year we will collect items for LWR School Kits in July. July is a good month as "back to school" sales usually begin in July. Instead of asking you to buy all of the items for a complete kit, starting June 30, there will be a tree in the entry that will have decorations listing the items for you to purchase. Each school kit must contain:

- ✓ Four 70-sheet notebooks of wide or college-ruled paper
- ✓ One 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- ✓ One blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- ✓ Five black/blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink)
- ✓ Five unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers
- ✓ One box of 16 or 24 crayons
- One pencil sharpener
- ✓ One eraser

Our goal is to assemble 30 complete Lutheran World Relief school kits. We ask for you to bring your items to church no later than August 10. Our Sunday School children will be assembling the kits as part of Back to Church Sunday.




# CEREAL BOX CHALLENGE

From now until August 10 we will be collecting cereal boxes for the food pantry at San Andreas. Cereal is a quick and easy breakfast for kids as they head out the door for school. On August 10, we are going to have a little fun and set up the boxes in a line and see how far we can make a chain reaction.



In a "domino effect"—one small action sets off a chain reaction, each piece knocking into the next. It's a powerful image of how a single moment can spark a cascade of consequences. When you pick up a few extra boxes of cereal at the store and remember who they're for You might find that with every act of generosity, your heart opens a little wider... and so does your joy. That's what Jesus promised— that his joy would be in us, and that our joy would be complete. That's what it means to be a disciple... a follower of Jesus. We participate in the mission to bring about the kingdom of God. So, start the chain reaction, set the first domino.

# 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Ordination

Dr. Bryan J. Rice, our pastor, mixes the usual with the unusual. At first glance he follows a traditional path. His military family put down roots in Nebraska and Bryan graduated from Bellevue West in 1988. Like many graduates he wanted to spread his wings and attend college away from home. He chose Augustana College in Sioux Falls SD to begin is college adventure. After his first year he decided to come back to Bellevue – maybe it was because his car got buried in snow on the street, but small-town Sioux Falls just wasn't for him. His brother was attending Creighton University and took Bryan to the admissions office to find out if he could transfer. He graduated in December 1992 with a BA in Art and a teaching certificate. Did you know French counts as a math credit? Ask him! See, the usual with the unusual.

Bryan's first teaching position was still close to home. Although he did his student teaching in Omaha at Belle Ryan and Benson high, he took his first fulltime position teaching high school art for Plattsmouth Public Schools. The highlight of the teaching years was marrying his high school sweetheart, Sheli in 1994.

With Sheli's encouragement, Bryan finally began to answer the call to ministry by entering seminary at Wartburg Theological Seminary in Dubuque, IA. But Bryan didn't pack up and move to Dubuque, he rented a crash pad with a couple of raccoons and opossums he fed through the back window near school and spent weekends and every day off back at home with Sheli. Many would consider this an unusual arrangement.

Finally, after 4 years of commuting, he was ordained at Christ Lutheran Church, Louisville, NE where his father Harold was pastor. He answered his first call as assistant pastor at Trinity Lutheran Church. It was at Trinity he began outreach with international Lutherans and refugees. In 2003 he and Sheli traveled with the Nebraska Synod to Tanzania leaving the twins at home with his parents. This was before smartphones and international cell phone plans, so what do you think was more stressful, international travel or two weeks away from the twins? He did enjoy the opportunity and picked up decorating ideas. Ask him about the paint scheme in the fellowship hall. Bryan worked with Sundanese refugees while at Trinity helping them with their religious services. Learning how to provide support within their culture and language. Unusual.

Bryan and Sheli were called to Christ the King in 2008. After getting settled as head Pastor and Katherine and Daniel in school, he decided to pursue his doctorate at Sioux Falls Seminary, completing his Doctor of Ministry in 2016. Doctor Bryan J. Rice. But with the usual, comes the unusual. He has coached archery and tennis teams at Cornerstone Christian School for the past 9 years, even after Daniel and Katheryn have long since graduated. He also coaches archery at Concordia Lutheran. He has been active with the Boy Scout troop that Christ the King sponsors for many years. He won awards for pottery and choreographed a dance presentation for the celebration of the 75th anniversary of Boy's Town. Besides being Pastor, Bryan is head of maintenance at Christ the King, Leads the youth programs and youth education, attends weekly bible study with adults. He leads the Christ the King support to San Andreas food pantry. In his limited spare time, he is beekeeper. Pastor Bryan has followed the usual path but shows how the unusual blends and improves the usual. Congratulations on your first 25 years as an ordained pastor!
